Notes from the First Lady Dianna Johnson:

The Christmas season to me means a time to celebrate that my Lord and Savior, Jesus, was born into this world. I know not all believe, but I know He is real in my life and I pray all will come to know Him as I do. Christmas is also a time to share the love of God with all; we should be doing this all year long. I love being able to meet with family and friends and celebrate.

This December I find myself reflecting on the year as we get ready to begin a new one. Gerald and I will celebrate 32 years of marriage this month. I am optimistic that 2022 will be a great year.

I have included a family favorite cookie recipe this month. Although they are sweet, they have a pastry taste to them. This recipe came from a Southern Living Christmas cookbook dated the year Gerald and I married, 1989.

ALMOND BUTTER FINGERS

½ cup chopped blanched almonds 1½ tablespoons granulated sugar ¾ cup (1½ sticks) butter, softened ⅓ cup granulated sugar 1 teaspoon almond extract 2 cups all-purpose flour 1 egg white

Combine almonds with the 1 ½ tablespoons of granulated sugar and set aside.

Beat together the butter, the ½ cup granulated sugar, and the almond extract in a medium-size bowl until the mixture is smooth. Stir in the flour until it is well blended.

Gather the dough into a ball and flatten it. Wrap the dough in aluminum foil or plastic wrap and chill the dough for 1 hour, or until it is firm enough to handle.

Preheat the oven to 350°.

Beat the egg white in a small bowl until it is frothy.

Divide the dough in half. Roll out each half on a floured surface to a rectangle ¼ inch thick and about 3 inches wide. Even the edges with a ruler to measure 2½ inches wide. Cut the rectangle crosswise into bars ¾ inch wide. Brush the tops with the egg white and sprinkle them evenly with the almond-sugar mixture. Lift the bars with a spatula to ungreased baking sheets, spacing the bars ¼ inch apart.

Bake in the preheated oven for 15 minutes, or until the cookies are golden brown. Transfer them to wire racks to cool. Store the cookies in tightly covered containers for up to 2 weeks.

The Childhood Health & Wellness Program will build on the highly successful **Childhood Cancer Campaign** to expand our impact. Childhood Health & Wellness will include four focus areas (not limited to the examples below):


- **Healthy Lifestyles** (Child Obesity, Healthy Eating, Physical Fitness, Happy Heart Advice, March of Dimes)

GATEWAY CCDHH CONTEST

Wouldn't it be wonderful if Optimists could help heal the young suffering from DEAFNESS. Until deafness is no longer a problem for children, Optimist Clubs sponsor the CCDHH contest for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing.

The contest speech is presented orally or by signing. Winners receive a scholarship to help further their education.

Optimist International provides guidelines for us to follow when conducting the contest. We ask that if you plan to have a CCDHH Contest that you follow all the rules as directed.

<u>Please DO Not</u> combine the CCDHH Contest with the Oratorical Contest. Judges and interpreters must come from the deaf community and be able to judge oral and signing speeches. Successful programs usually happen when clubs work with their local school system's programs for the deaf. A recent Audiogram must be included in the student's contest application.

As of now we are not planning any contests before the first of next year. If Covid problems continue in our school systems, there will only be club contests.

We will not conduct Zone or District Contests that might put our contestants in harms way. Heaven knows the young people have enough problems without us adding more!

Optimist Clubs may choose a location and distribute copies of the Optimist Creed so others may choose optimism for themselves.



First Ladies Bonus Recipe

Raspberry Shortbread

1 cup butter, softened 2/3 cup sugar 2 ½ cups all-purpose flour 1 (10 oz.) jar seedless Raspberry jam, divided*

1 ½ cups powdered sugar 3 ½ table spoons water

½ teaspoon almond extract

Beat butter and sugar at medium speed with an electric mixer until light and fluffy. Gradually add flour, beating at low speed until blended. Divide dough into 6 equal portions; roll each portion into a 12 x 1 inch strip. Place strips on lightly greased baking sheets. (I use a Pampered Chef baking stone ungreased)

Make a ½-inch wide by ¼ inch deep indentation down center of each strip using the handle of a wooden spoon. Spoon half of jam evenly into indentions. Bake at 350 ° for 15 minutes. Remove from oven; spoon remaining jam into indentions. Bake for 5 more minutes or until lightly browned.

Whisk together powdered sugar, water, and extract; drizzle over warm shortbread. Cut each strip diagonally into 10inch slices. Cool in pans on wire racks. Yield: 6 dozen.




