

New Club Building in 4 Steps

It is no secret that we need new Clubs in the Georgia District, and the 2014-2015 Leadership Team has made the commitment to add a record-breaking number of Clubs this year. These new club building steps were presented at the Leadership Retreat at Lake Blackshear Resort in September.

Step 1: Needs Assessment

A needs assessment is exploring the way things are versus the way they could be within a community. This first step is simply identifying the purposes of the new Optimist Club. What are some opportunities for service within the community? How could a Club help bring this about? Can a Club achieve the desired results? What are the costs and benefits of a Club to the community?

Step 2: Recruitment

Recruitment is simply the process of adding like-minded individuals to an Optimist Club for the purposes of "Bringing Out the Best in Kids!"

Step 3: Meetings

Meetings are the process of coming together as an assembly for a common purpose during the formation of an Optimist Club. There are two types of meetings in New Club building—Informational and Organizational. Informational meetings are held to inform prospective members about the mission, values, and structure of Optimist Clubs and to identify service opportunities within the community.

Step 4: Follow-Up

Follow-up is the ongoing process, led by the District, ensuring that each New Club becomes a strong, viable asset with effective leadership that provides excellent service to the community.

Participate in the Community Project Awards and Win

The questions from the CPA Project Story should be answered during the video, and the entry must be submitted on a CD. In the Best Writing CPA category, Clubs are asked to complete the Project Story, and instead of printing it and the supporting documents, save these details to a CD in .pdf format.

Clubs can submit as many entries as they like in either of the categories. However, each project may only be entered in one category. All entries must be submitted to Optimist International on a non-returnable CD in either .pdf or .wp4 format by December 15. Your Club could win \$500 to help carry out your work in the community!

Little did Jack know his challenge would soon be accepted!

Joey Richardson and Anita Still began to talk about new ideas to build a non-traditional Club that would serve the entire state. Through their conversation, ideas grew and flourished. But where would the new members come from? We have non-members who attend our District meetings who want to be involved, but they don't want to belong to a traditional Club. They want to help, but are not quite sure how.

Here's how. The idea of a non-traditional, unconventional, all-female sisterhood of Optimists, the Ya Ya Sisterhood Optimist Club, was born. As the women talked, the list of charter members began to grow. By 7:30, Friday evening, we already had 10 charter members! At 9:30 on Friday night, several members met with New Club Building Chair Johnny Young to make sure we could build the Club in our time frame. If we could get the members, we could build the Club.

At 9:00 on Saturday morning, we had 25 charter members. The Sisterhood was growing. We talked to members. We talked to non-members, wives, significant others, daughters, friends. We talked to anyone who would listen.

Governor Hal Sewell and most of the men had no idea what was taking place. It was, after all, the Georgia Convention, and our concern was carrying out the duties of the District. And we did. We attended classes. We participated in the Optimist boardwalk booths. We went on tours. All was well at the District Convention.

By 2:00, Saturday afternoon, we had the 15 new members required to bring in the Club. These members brought the total to 28. In a whirlwind of paperwork – all sorts of new Club documents, applications, and money – the excitement was growing! We were almost unable to contain ourselves. By 4:00, we had 35 members, and the group was still growing.

At 6:00 on Saturday evening, the charter meeting of the Ya Ya Sisterhood Optimist Club was held. Sue Creswell, the visiting OI representative, oversaw the meeting, insuring that applications and charter fees were collected. With contagious excitement, Sue joined the Sisterhood. Our friends, Essie and Katherine from the Tennessee District, joined the group as well – 41 women in total. Four officers and six Board members were elected. A tiara was presented to each Ya Ya, and we were off to the Governor's Banquet.

Conference and Convention Chair Rose Kohler presented a clean napkin to Governor Hal and told him to hold on to it because he was going to need it. Rose and New Club Building Chair, Johnny Young, then approached the podium and began to talk about building new Clubs and the challenges we face. The Ya Yas in the audience began putting on their tiaras. Rose told Governor Hal that a new Club had been built in less than 24 hours. That's when the celebration began. The Ya Yas jumped up, threw their hands in the air and shouted "YA YA!" Governor Hal thought it was a joke. Sue assured him that the Club had indeed chartered just before the banquet began. At that point, Hal picked up the napkin Rose had given him earlier and wiped tears of joy from his eyes. With a catch in his voice he said, "It truly is a wonderful life!"

The crowd was stunned by the Ya Ya's accomplishment. With excitement, smiles, laughter, and many tears of happiness, the song "Celebration" by Kool and the Gang began to play. The Ya Yas danced in a line around the room, high-fiving the crowd. With so many charter members, no one knew where the line began or ended. It was one big circle – a sisterhood ready to work for the Georgia District.

On Sunday morning, Jack Creswell installed the newly-elected officers and Board members, and then installed all 49 charter members of the Club.

The Ya Ya Sisterhood Optimist Club will hold meetings at every District conference. At each location, the Club will complete a service project that is needed in the area. For example, we are looking at Eagle Ranch Children's Home – a home for nearly 70 boys and girls in crisis and in need of hope and healing – as our first project.

With charter members from Georgia, Tennessee, Pennsylvania, and Alabama, we are so proud of our amazing Club! This Optimist Sisterhood was conceived, built, and chartered in less than 24 hours. Are you ready to build your Club?




